As Camp Lichterman continues to grow going into its sixth season, the teacher/naturalist will be responsible for promoting camps, creating new and engaging agendas for Camp Lichterman's many camps while building more camp weeks where possible in the summer and school year breaks. Training of Camp Lichterman staff is a responsibility also. Teacher/Naturalist will be responsible for promoting Camp

Lichterman at public community events such as Camp Expo, STEM nights at schools, and other pertinent events.

The need for scout programs which fill certain badge requirements are growing at Lichterman Nature Center especially on Saturdays. Teacher/naturalist will be responsible for building and promoting these programs while interfacing with scout leaders to determine needs of their troop.

Teacher/naturalist will be responsible for promoting scout events in the community such as Scouts at Graceland event and other scout events and dinners where invited.

Other duties include teaching school programs as needed, taking camp and scout reservations, budgeting and buying needed supplies for camps and scouts, safety training of camp/scout staff, and others set forth by the Chief Teacher/Naturalist.

• At least 2 years of experience in a similar field (camp director, scout leader, naturalist, educator and etc.)
