
## Robert Church, the Hooks family and Aretha: New museum to showcase South Memphis

South Memphis — the part of the city that birthed notable figures including Robert R. Church, the Hooks family, Aretha Franklin and Booker T. Jones — will be home to a new museum telling its story.

The South City Museum and Culture Center is planned for the former Porter Junior High School and MLK Transition Academy site at  $620\,\mathrm{S}$ . Lauderdale St. Its proposed opening is summer 2024.
